

In the Melanau traditional practice of Nipah palm weaving, the weaver transforms a long flat strip of Nipah palm into a finished bird sculpture through folding and sculpting techniques. For the Melanau, the bird often symbolizes healing, in the hope of recovering from their illnesses. It is also the most iconic Nipah weaving figure, representing the dove, known for its long spiritual lifespan and auspicious symbolism. Doves are seen as carriers of souls to paradise, embodying peace between good and evil spirits.
